#### | Project Brief

Whilst building the Sky Academy, Willmott Dixon's Wales & West team hosted an on site taster session focusing on the art of plastering. With some help from our supply chain partner Morrissey Drylining, we were able to offer the students the opportunity to have a go at plastering. Working alongside Site Manager, Warwick and Assistant Site Manager, Scott, the students spent their time working on pre prepped walls that Morrissey had set out to allow them to master the right technique before getting the plaster on the walls as smoothly as possible. The students were then offered the opportunity to have a tour of the site and a discussion about the other roles available in construction with support in how to look for apprenticeships and other work experience opportunities.



The boys really enjoyed the opportunity to go onsite and have the opportunity to try something new. We have a lot of students who like the idea of construction so for Willmott Dixon to work with our students and tailor a program to suit them was fantastic. we all really appreciate everyone taking the time out and we hope to continue working together going forward

#### HAZELBROOK SEN **TAUNTON**



During the project the London and East team engaged with Selworthy School students to familiarise them with the building and undertake bricklaying activities. Through the commitment of time and resources with our supply chain, we converted a former building into 'The Grove', a new Sixth Form Centre providing a common room, changing places WC. two classrooms, a mock flat and café.

Since building their new Hazelbrook campus in 2019, we have maintained a fantastic relationship with the careers team and students at Selworthy School in Taunton. We have been invited back yearly to take part in their annual careers week where we can showcase construction careers and STEM activities.

Site tours were provided for the students for a way in which they could feel a part of the process. Change can be scary to those with additional needs so importance is always placed on making them feel as if they are included in the build.

Whilst constructing their Hazelbrook campus, We also offered students and staff the opportunity to sign bricks that were then placed within the wall as well as regular tours for the students to allow them to see the progress that was being made.



### | Project Brief

A key requirement of the project was to create flexible space, as pupil needs can change year on year, so a space that can adapt is essential. The structure was designed to facilitate this by constructing a solid concrete soffit which allows hoists to be easily installed or removed anywhere on the ground floor with no remedial works to the structure required. Teaching spaces were kept to a standard shape and layout throughout were designed for general needs. Any classroom can be adapted, allowing equipment designed for a particular student or activity to move with the student to new classrooms as they progress through the school.







#### HERTFORDSHIRE CONSTABULARY **HEADQUARTERS**



London and East hosted 30 young people from schools and colleges in Bedfordshire, aged 15-18 for 4 days worth of work experience. Throughout the week the students were introduced to a multitude of our people, to hear the various roles and responsibilities within our business. The students were all assigned a team where they have spent time building their social skills, motivating each other and working on their problem solving skills.

Each team was given a project to design, cost plan and market a community hub with a budget, concluding on the last day with presenting their ideas to a panel of judges.

During the four days the students heard various presentations from our people to help them gain insight, tips and tricks to help them with their project. They were invited to a networking session with 30 of our people and our Supply Chain. The networking event showed the students that it is okay to approach people and ask questions and become confident in introducing yourself as who knows where an opportunity might present itself

for your future career progression.

The week demonstrated that with a bit of bravery and stepping out of their comfort zone they can achieve so much. Our people being involved in these events has shown that time given is so valuable to the future generation even in the busy periods and helps to enhance our skills as mentors.



During the week the students confidence grew they really came into their own and had no issues presenting to our judging panel. The winners were a group who called themselves Broad Contractors, but notes from the judges stated that it was a very close call between all the groups!

It's been fantastic working with other students my age, coming up with ideas together and getting out of our comfort zones. Willmott Dixon is a brilliant place to be, better than other work experiences where you're left at the side on your own. I've benefitted from being around other likeminded students and getting the experience here.

#### **BRENT INDIAN COMMUNITY CENTRE AND HOMES**



The London Borough of Brent has appointed Willmott Dixon to build 55 affordable homes as well as two community centres.

The largest is the £17.3m Brent Indian Centre project, which involves demolition of an existing building to be replaced with a new community facility and 29 affordable homes. The current building's occupants, the Brent Indian Community, will move into the new development, which will include a large multi-purpose hall, commercial kitchen, offices and an IT training room.

The second project is the nearby £13.6m Learie Constantine Community Centre project, which included a building demolished to make way for the Learie Constantine Centre's new home, along with 26 new homes made up of one, two and three-bedroom apartments.



During the construction of the project Willmott Dixon's team at Brent Indian Community Centre got stuck in helping at a local foodbank. The team helped sort the food to check that it was in -date, they also helped with packaging up the food into storage boxes ready to be given to people who are referred to the food bank.

At the heart of the new Wixams development, is an inspiring educational facility for local young people, with a dedicated sixth form centre and specialist science laboratories; music room and recording studio; high-tech computing labs; creative design studio; large open plan learning resource centre; sports hall; and multi-use games areas.

The Wixams Academy is an example of how good collaboration between a developer, a local authority, Scape Procure, Lungfish Architects and Willmott Dixon can create over 1,200 new school places.

'Shedspace for your Headspace' was built in the grounds of the school to offer a safe environment where students can find a relaxation and sensory stimulation during less structured times like playtimes. It provides a quiet, relaxing space for pupils who need a few moments of calm.

The pupils played a key role in designing the cabin with our volunteers and supply chain partners helping to make their vision a reality.

They celebrated the opening of their new space with a ribbon cutting and some well-earned cake and biscuits attended by Tina Holt SEND Manager of Bedford Borough Council.

#### **ALL THROUGH SCHOOL OAKLEY GROVE**



#### **Project Brief**

The state-of-the-art all-through school in Warwick will comprise of a 34-place nursery, 420-place primary and 900-place secondary school. See more here: https://youtu.be/rOSw4gxnuJM.

The design takes a fabric-first approach to reduce energy consumption and limit operational carbon emissions. The building will also feature air source heat pumps and PV panels as part of a renewable energy strategy.

The school will provide a stand-alone sports hall, several natural turf pitches and an all-weather pitch - both of which are for educational and community use. All playing surfaces will also be delivered to Sport England design standards.

Willmott Dixon's Midlands team will be investing heavily in the local community. This includes committing to delivering a £1.5m social ROI through social value activities such as delivering careers talks, work experience, traineeships for those not in employment, education or training, and creating local job opportunities.

During the project Willmott Dixon have partnered with Prospects part of the The shaw Trust, the UK's largest Notfor-Profit (NFP) social enterprise in the employment sector. They put people at the centre, knowing the right support at the right time can make a huge difference to an individual's life. They empower people from childhood to career through their services embracing employability, education, learning and skills, children's services and health and wellbeing support.

#### **Our Impact, Our Legacy**

Throughout the duration of the project, our Midlands team will be giving back to the local community.

We will be offering work experience opportunities, CV and employability workshops and running our award-winning Enrichment Programme at a local secondary school. The programme, which spans over six weeks, which will teach students about the careers available in construction, the importance of sustainable construction and students will earn a Bronze Industrial Cadets certificate.

The new building will be net-zero in operation (regulated) and is designed to be BREEAM Very Good. The school's design incorporates numerous sustainability elements to help lower running costs and future-proof it, including air source heat pumps, a PV array on the roof and seven electric vehicle charging points.


